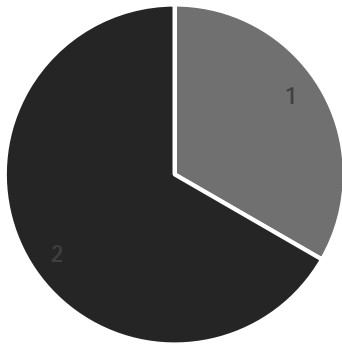
We are very grateful to all the responses that we received. We hope you find the information easy to understand and of interest to you and your community.

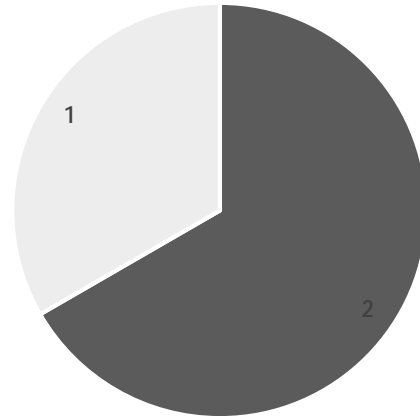
The engagement has been undertaken at a place level and respondents provided their postcode, groupings of postcodes have created settlement/community level detail.

Though new affordable housing is supposed to be being built next to the new childcare and office facilities at the head of Loch Fyne. Over the last 5 years an increasing number of houses that have been sold in the area have been bought by wealthy, retired or semi-retired people moving in, with the majority used as second homes.
